Our Experience at the National Students for Life Conferences

On January 22nd and 28th, Josh and I were at the Students for Life National Conferences in San Francisco and Washington DC. It's a great place to connect with students and share about our work even in a year like last year when we aren't speaking at the conference, but this year was special. Josh was asked to speak on pro-life apologetics in the morning and then he spoke on dialogue tips in the afternoon with our friend Rebecca Haschke from Justice For All.

The two days before the first conference were insane. This conference was an incredible opportunity for ERI, particularly given that we're working hard to promote the Equipped for Life Course. We wanted to make the speeches even better than usual, so I went hard to work strengthening different sections while Josh went hard to work learning brand new material I was handing him. One of Josh's strengths as a speaker is an uncanny ability to memorize new content quickly. After seeing the final result, it was well worth the effort. I've seen Josh speak dozens of times, and he was at the very top of his game at these conferences, particularly in DC. You can see both presentations at EqualRightsInstitute.com/Speech.

Gratifying as the success of Josh's speech was, the highlight of both conferences was our time at our booth talking with students. In the last year we have had to spend so much time in the office developing the Equipped for Life Course that it became easy to feel discouraged. Josh's first talk was in the morning at both conferences, and after those talks were finished, our booth was packed with students! It ranged from being sometimes one or two at a time to crowds around the booth asking for our help on arguments they've been wrestling with.

Josh spent a few minutes at the end of his speeches talking about the Equipped for Life Course, where students can go to learn even more and become better equipped for outreach. He also announced that we've raised 70 scholarships from our donors who are excited about training clubs for outreach, and encouraged students to come to our booth to ask us questions and/or purchase the course. By the end of the second conference four students bought individual memberships to the course, 11 groups bought a membership for up to 20 members, one group bought a membership for up to 40 members, and three people paid for scholarships and gave them in person to specific groups they were already connected with!

One of our favorite moments was when two ladies come up to our booth right after Josh's first speech in San Francisco. They brought two students from Arizona State University with them and announced to me, "We want to buy THEM the course!" I thought it was so sweet that these ladies wanted to bless this club by helping them in a very tangible way to grow.

It was also great to talk to the dozens of students who came to our booth throughout the day. Many of them came to pose interesting and challenging questions to us, a few of them only stopped by to take selfies with us, but most of them wanted us to know the impact we've made in their lives. **We even got to meet one student who told us about how she has used material she learned from us to successfully out-debate her philosophy professor in class!** It was incredibly encouraging to talk with so many pro-life people who have benefited so much from our work, and to see the course really take off.
